Happy December, everyone. Hopefully, you all had a wonderful Thanksgiving and were able to spend time with family and friends. We had our usual house full of people and I still managed to eat way too much.

Because we will start out in January approving a budget for the club I want to discuss some of the questions we hear from membership about financial aspects of our club.

- **Q;** My primary renewal costs \$55 each year. Where does that money go?
- **A;** Out of that \$55 we send \$25 to the National Council of Corvette Clubs. The remaining \$30 stays with our club
- **Q**; We also pay \$20 for my spouse to renew their membership each year.
- **A;** Our club keeps \$10 of that money and sends the other \$10 to the NCCC.

So as you can see, for every primary member we keep \$30 and for every couple we get \$40. This is the money that covers the general operating costs of the club. This includes Postage, Printing, Insurance, Internet Fees, etc. Another question we get from time to time is:

- **Q;** Why are we spending so much money with the NCCC, we're? not a racing club?
- A; Aside from the fact that our club is one of the founding members of the NCCC, we receive many benefits from our affiliation with them. The NCCC is largely focused on the competition aspect of the Corvette hobby, including various types of racing, car shows rallies and others. Our club has many members who participate in the points and awards programs they offer. One of the most important incentives offered is their "umbrella" liability insurance

coverage that extends to all of the club events. In addition to providing financial protection to the club and our membership, it

also provides an insurance credential that is required by venues like Spartan Speedway, Potter Park Zoo and others. In short, our club probably could not exist in it's current form without our

NCCC affiliation.

I know this doesn't come close to answering all your questions but I hope it provides some information that will help you as we work toward an approved "09" budget.

Because this is the last newsletter of the year, I want to again mention what a great year Sandy and I have had with you all. You are a very special group of friends and we very much enjoy the time that we spend with you. We have a great new board for 2009 and I hope you all are looking forward as I am to another fun year.

Kathy also explained our Christmas party will be held on Wednesday, December 3rd, at Brookshire Inn in Williamston. There will be a cash bar. The price is \$25.00 per person. Carol Putmon is collecting money. Don't forget to bring a gift for our white elephant exchange. Wrapped items should be valued for at least \$10.00 and marked "man" or "woman". Bob Maynard will be collecting donations for the Lansing Food Bank. Kathy further advised that our Winterfest will take place at the Wagon Wheel Banquet Room in Portland on Saturday January 10th. CAPITAL CITY CORVETTE CLUB Board Meeting – November 19, 2008

President John Bechtel called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Absent: Shalimar Maynard and Gary Wyma. Members of the 2009 board were present at the meeting in a non-voting capacity.

Reports:

Secretary: Sandy Bechtel presented the minutes of the October 15, 2008 board meeting. Rich Bratschi moved to approve them as written. Bob Maynard seconded. Motioned passed.

Ambassador: No report.

Points: Carrie Hutton advised that the points are up-to-date on our website.

Membership: Based on 2009 renewals, Colleen Bratschi advised we have 94 regular, 1 honorary, and 73 F.C.O.A. members. She noted a check is being forwarded to Barb Harris at NCCC for their portion of the renewal monies collected by our club. She also explained that NCCC plans to share our email addresses with their sponsors. This is the first time they have requested this information. A majority of the board members approved releasing our email addresses to NCCC. Colleen also noted that our current membership roster has been given to board members. Since this is the season for storage, and also the season for field mice looking for indoor homes, I thought I'd share something that has worked for me over the years. It seems to eliminate most mice in the garage and buildings (and cars) in short order.

I use a 5 gallon plastic pail with about 3 inches of 50/50 antifreeze mix in the bottom. I drill two small holes across the diameter of the pail, about at the top edge. Insert a stiff wire (like an piece of old stainless steel antenna, in this case) through one side, then through a pop or beer can, and then through the other side of the pail. That's it.



Coat the can with peanut butter and a few bird seeds or whatever and place it next to a shelf or something so the mice can get to it. When the mouse tries to get onto the can for the food, it spins and he falls into the antifreeze. Dead mouse, and well preserved so no smell. You'll collect a half dozen or more in short order. Keep it where pets cannot get into it. Maybe a cover of some sort would suffice, as long as it lets the mice in. Dispose of properly. Disgusting but it works.

I think I got this idea from Randy P. years ago, or my brother, or whoever. I take no credit.


