#### Chuck and Sharon Fast Join One Acre Club



# **NCCC Family Helping Family Program**

This is an explanation for use of the NCCC Family Helping Family program with some guidelines to use.

We would like for this program to be available for use by all NCCC members. If you are traveling and something would happen to you or your car, wouldn't it be better to have a fellow NCCC member to help you out instead of a stranger?

To make this program successful, we will need to enlist your Club and Region's assistance. Each Region Executive is asked to forward this information to each of the Governors in their region to sign up at least two or more club members from each individual club to be on the contact list. We hope out of each club member that signs up, we would have someone that has mechanical knowledge, someone with a trailer, someone with a spare bed and if someone wanted to stop and have a cup of coffee and conversation that we have someone sign up for just that.

If you decide to sign up, then you have agreed to provide assistance for free, to help out a fellow NCCC member. You have made a commitment to respond as soon as you can or to find someone else who can. We don't want someone to wait for hours just because it may be in the middle of the night. If it was you that was needing help, you would want someone to respond as quickly as possible. We would hope that the person receiving assistance would offer some type of appreciation, maybe help with gas money or even lunch.

This list will not be used for outside Solicitations or Distribution. It is intended to be used for

NCCC member assistance. Please do not use this list to ask about what tires to buy or if you are looking for a particular part unless you have broken down and this is the kind of assistance you need. Do not make a mailing list for solicitations or jokes from this list.

Use the list for the purpose it was created for.

Each member of NCCC will be informed on how to access this list by information provided by their club's governor. A separate form will be used for you to volunteer and that will also be placed on the NCCC web site. The information you provide will be in a secure non-publicly linked area. We ask that the form or information on the form be sent to 3 individuals who have volunteered to help get this program started. Each of the 3 individuals will have certain Regions assigned to them and we ask that you submit your information to that individual.

#### Be the First to See the C7 Produced

June 27-28 enthusiasts have the opportunity to celebrate Corvette's history, look at its future, see how the future gets built and kick off the NCM Motorsports Park with a groundbreaking ceremony.

Although the plant has been closed for public tours and will remain closed until this Fall, special arrangements have been made to allow 200 Corvette enthusiasts to enter and tour the Bowling Green Assembly Plant during the event. This very special opportunity includes the plant tour and dinner on Thursday evening. NCM members can enjoy priority sign-up for \$250 until March 1st when it will become available to non-members as well. Be among the very first to see the new C7 up close and see how it's built.

A 60 Years of Corvette Evolution display along with seminars will delve into Corvette's storied history. Some of the first C7s will be on display for a real tire-kicking walk around unveiling the latest and greatest Corvettes and all of the new equipment and performance. The GM Corvette teams from Detroit and Bowling Green will be on hand to demonstrate and explain.



The two-day event is free and open to members and non-members alike, although non-members will have to pay for admission to enter the Museum display areas. Click here for more details and to register.







# 10 Most Common Causes of Poor Gas Mileage

- 1. Tires: Under-inflated tires are a common cause of poor gas mileage. Pull out your owner's manual and note the recommended tire inflation for your vehicle. Gas mileage drops by one percent for every 2 lbs the tires are under-inflated. Properly inflated tires increase gas mileage by up to 3 percent.
- **2. Speed:** The U.S. Department of Energy indicates that gas mileage rates begin to decrease at speeds over 60 mph. Maintaining a slower speed can result in a 7 to 23 percent savings in fuel economy.
- 3. Heavy Trunk: Extra weight in your car causes the engine to work harder and lowers gas mileage. Remove excess items from your trunk and any car carriers. A reduction of 100 lbs in excess weight can save 1 to 2 percent in fuel economy.
- **4. Inconsistent Driving:** Cars perform best when driven consistently. Sudden acceleration, or braking, can decrease gas mileage. The U.S. Department of Energy indicates that erratic driving can decrease gas mileage by as much as 5 to 33 percent. The use of cruise control on the highway can help you maintain a constant driving speed and improve gas mileage.
- **5. Tune-Ups:** Not following the recommended schedule for your car's tune-ups can increase your gas consumption. Regular tune-ups will increase gas mileage by up to 4 percent. Refer to your owner's manual for the correct tune-up schedule for your car.
- **6. Roof Rack:** A roof rack may help you load extra items onto your car, but it will also decrease your gas mileage. A roof rack changes the aerodynamics of your car and increases the air resistance, resulting in poor gas mileage. Extra items carried on the rack add weight to the car and contribute to poor mileage. Remove the rack if it is not needed. A loaded roof rack may decrease your gas mileage by 5 percent.
- **7 Errands:** The amount of gas your car consumes is greatly increased by the number of trips you make trying to finish your daily errands. Combine trips to cut down on gas expense. Review your errands for the week and plan to take

- care of errands in the same general location on one trip.
- **8. Idling:** Keeping your car running, while not going anywhere, is a waste of gasoline. Idling contributes to gas consumption and contributes nothing to gas mileage. It also contributes to pollution. Turn off your car when waiting.
- **9. Oil Choice:** It is important to use the proper oil for your automobile. The incorrect choice can result in poor gas mileage. Use the type of oil recommended by your car's manufacturer. Look for the American Petroleum Institute symbol on the motor oil container. If the symbol indicates "Energy Conserving" the oil has been designed to improve fuel economy.
- **10 Oxygen Sensor:** An oxygen sensor interprets the amount of oxygen in your car's exhaust and uses that information to adjust the car's fuel consumption. An improperly functioning oxygen sensor can to lead to poor gas mileage. Fixing an oxygen sensor may improve your car's gas consumption by as much as 40 percent.
