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Would-be carjackers foiled by mysteries of the stick shift

An attempted stickup was confounded by a car's stick shift, when would-be carjackers failed to understand the mechanics behind a manual transmission.

Randolph Bean tells WOFL FOX 35 that two men attempted to steal his 2002 yellow Corvette at gunpoint outside an Orlando hospital, but they ended up running away after they couldn't figure out how to drive his car.

"They apparently couldn't start it," Bean 51, is quoted as saying in a police report. "I had to tell him four different times to push in the clutch, because it's a standard transmission."

After several failed attempts, the thieves eventually fled the scene.

"My first thought was I guess we don't have driver's ed. in school anymore, because no one knows how to drive a stick. And my second thing was, don't shoot me because you can't start the car," Bean said. "I'm trying to help you out here, you know. Thankfully they didn't."

However, the foiled carjackers did not leave entirely empty-handed. "They got away with my phone, they got my keys, they got my wallet," Randolph told the Fox affiliate.

Still, Randolph was pretty forgiving when asked what message he had for the "handsome young men, who did not look like car thieves."

"Guys, turn your life around. You guys have got a lot going for you," he said. "Thank you for not taking my life for something silly as a car."

Best Chevrolet Corvette movie appearances

Corvettes have always had a certain amount of glamour that translates well onto the big screen. In time, we have no doubt that the new 2014 seventh-generation Corvette will make its fair share of movie appearances. For now, though, we look back at some of the Corvette's best starring and supporting roles:

 "Corvette Summer" (1978): In his first post-Luke Skywalker role, Mark Hamill plays a high school loner who manages to build a fantastic custom Corvette. Not surprisingly, in real life, the Corvette was not built by a high school shop student. Two cars were built by famous

- customizer Dick Korkes and both of the movie cars survive today in the hands of private collectors.
- "Animal House" (1978): "Animal House" was a low-budget sleeper about a raunchy frat house that turned into a mega-hit. Delta house lothario Eric "Otter" Stratton drives a Roman Red with white coves 1959 Corvette convertible with a removable hard top. Since the movie was set in 1962, Stratton was clearly a kid of privilege who no doubt disappointed his parents.
- 3. "Body Heat" (1981): Sleazy lawyer Ned Racine, played by William Hurt, drives a very tired-looking 1964 Corvette roadster in this neo-noir classic. Then just a 17-year-old used car, both the 'Vette and its driver look like they've seen far better days.
- 4. "Star Trek" (2009): While no one knows for sure if cars will still be on the road in the 23rd century, we like J.J. Abrams' assertion that they'll still be around and still be the objects of collectors' attention. Sadly, we find out that young not-yet-captain James T. Kirk was a bit of a juvenile delinquent, and the 1965 Corvette Sting Ray convertible belonging to his stepfather comes to a bad end at the conclusion of a joyride by Jim Kirk.
- 5. "Billy Jack" (1971): "Billy Jack" was the title character in an odd series of four rather preachy movies produced by Tom Laughlin, who coincidentally starred as Billy Jack in all of them. The wooden Laughlin made Al Gore look like a natural in front of the camera. And, strangely, while Billy Jack professed to abhor violence, it seems like 100 minutes of the movie's 114-minute running time consist of Billy Jack beating the daylights out of someone. One such beating culminates in Billy Jack forcing a baddie to drive his Riverside Gold 1969 big block Corvette convertible into a lake. Another unfortunate end to a great-looking Corvette.
- 6. "Apollo 13" (1995): Going back to Project Mercury, there's always been a strong connection between astronauts and Corvettes. In this Ron Howard classic, at least several Apollo astronauts are seen driving early '70s Corvettes. We like the scene with Tom Hanks as Commander Jim Lovell pulling up next to a Shelby GT350 Mustang at a stoplight in a Monza Red 1970 Corvette coupe.



GM Performance Build Center Relocating to Bowling Green

The Performance Build Center, currently located in Wixom, MI, will move to the GM Chevrolet Corvette Assembly Plant by the first quarter of 2014. The PBC employs 29 and builds engines for the Grand Sport Coupe manual, Z06, 427 Convertible and ZR1.

"I'm very happy to announce today that GM will move its Performance Build Center, which allows engine enthusiasts to build their own specialty engines, from Michigan, and we're going to bring it right here to Bowling Green," said Arvin Jones, Manufacturing Manager for GM North America at the January 30 press conference.

In 2010 GM announced the launch of the Corvette Engine Build Experience, where buyers can assist in the building of their engine. The owner's name is then affixed on a special plate on their engine, next to the one bearing the name of the master builder.

"We've got lots of excitement headed our way," said GM Bowling Green Assembly Plant Manager Dave Tatman. "We intend to make the full transition to the Performance Build Center by the first quarter of 2014. Lots of details have got to be worked out yet, but obviously we wanted to share that great news with you. As you think about this, I know Wendell, that you and your team are jumping up and down thinking about how we can continue to combine our efforts between the National Corvette Museum and the Bowling Green Assembly Plant and this new opportunity, and we look forward to those discussions as well."







- 3. Turn right onto M-43 E/Gull Rd, go 5 Miles, 7 Minutes
- 4. Slight right onto D Ave E, go 374 Feet
- 5. Turn left onto M-43 E/N 32nd St
- 6. Continue to follow M-43 E, go 5.7 Miles, 9 Minutes
- 7. Turn right onto W Hickory Rd
- 8. Gilmore Car Museum is on your right, 0.1 Miles

From US-131: (Total Driving Time: 17 Miles, 23 Minutes)



- 1. US131 Take exit 49A to merge onto M-89 E/Allegan St toward Plainwell
- 2. Continue to follow M-89 E 12 Miles, About 16 minutes
- 3. Turn left onto M-43 E/N 32nd St
- 4. Continue to follow M-43 E 4.7 Miles, About 7 minutes
- 5. Turn right onto W Hickory Rd
- 6. Gilmore Car Museum is on your right, 0.1 Miles



2013 NCCC Convention Invitation

So what are your vacation plans for 2013? The National Council of Corvette Clubs has planned for the last week of June, the 25th through the 29th to give you an opportunity to meet with several of your Council friend s in Bowling Green, Kentucky. Along with being a scenic section of the country, this area offers a lot of historical places to visit, great places to shop, parties and entertainment along with the chance to compete if you so desire.

This will be the second time that Council has held the National Convention in Bowling Green. Our host hotel is the University Plaza Holiday. It is the only full service hotel in the area so you would never have to leave if you so choose. There is a variety of fine restaurants within walking distance of the



hotel and you are an hour's drive from Nashville's country glamour and scenery. There will be bus tours available to Nashville, one will be a guided tour featuring the highlights of downtown Nashville, admission to the Ryman Auditorium, the Country Music Hall of Fame, The Hermitage and lunch at Two Twenty Two Grill. Other tours will include self-guided tours of downtown Nashville, Gaylord Opryland Hotel, Opry Mills Outlets and the famous "Nash Trash" tour. Bus tours are scheduled for Mammoth Cave which will include a walking visit to one of the world's largest caves, a Bourbon Country tour that will include stops at Makers Mark and the Buffalo Trace distilleries and the National Corvette Museum are just minutes away from the Hotel. Monday night we will have the Competitors Award Dinner, Friday will have the Convention Awards Breakfast and the National Awards Dinners and Corvette Raffle on Friday evening.

There will be the usual competitive events including the cars shows, funkhana, rallies and the drag events at the NHRS sanctioned Beech Bend Drag Strip. The low and high speed events will take place at the Nashville Fairgrounds. There will be a party in Lost River Cave on Tuesday night, a Sock Hop on Wednesday night and Game Night on Thursday which will include the now famous Valve Cover Challenge. We are working with the hotel to see that we have a smooth check in and that there is plenty of parking for all those at the Holiday Inn with golf carts to get your luggage from your trailers to the hotel lobby. The Crosswinds Golf Course will be the site of the Golf Outing; the course is next door to the hotel if you want to get in a round or two during the week. We hope that when you go home you will take memories that will last a life time of the fun and good times you had on this vacation.

As in past the room reservations will be handled by the Convention Treasurer as you register for Convention. When the Holiday Inn fills we have limited commitments from the Marriott and Hilton Garden Inn to honor the room rate of the Holiday. They are located across the street from the Holiday Inn.

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Final C6 Rolls off the Assembly Line

This morning [February 28, 2013] at 8:04 a.m., the last 2013 Corvette came off the line at the Bowling Green Assembly Plant. The celebration was short lived, as less than 30 minutes after the last car was built, workers began remodeling the plant to prepare for the launch of the all-new 2014 Corvette Stingray.

A total of 215,100 sixth-generation "C6" Corvettes were made at Bowling Green Assembly since production began in 2005, the last of which was the exclusive 2013 Corvette 427 Convertible Collector Edition outfitted with the 60th Anniversary design package.

The last C6 Corvette will join other historic General Motors vehicles at the GM Heritage Center in Warren, Mich. Even as the team celebrated building the last C6, Plant Manager Dave Tatman said there has been a great deal of anticipation and excitement toward building the all-new Stingray.

"The last C6 rolls off the line at 8:04 a.m. and I'll have people in here at 8:30 a.m. to start tearing down and putting in new tools," Tatman said.



The task will

require that 120 workers take just four weeks to turn the Bowling Green plant around, completing a job that usually takes months to accomplish. All employees are slated to return to work on March 25, where they will learn the entirely new process required to build the Stingray.


Bowling Green Assembly, which hosts up to 50,000 visitors a year, is currently closed to the public to facilitate the remodeling of the line. Tatman said he plans to reopen the plant to outside tours as soon as possible, knowing that everyone is excited to see this new generation of Corvette built. However, he says this will not likely happen until Fall.

"As I always say, we don't build cars, we build dreams," Tatman said.

The 2014 NCM National Corvette Caravan

Greetings Ladies and Gentlemen,

My name is Paul Mariano and I am the National Chair for the 2014 NCM Caravan. For those of you not familiar with the caravans, I'll present a little history. If you are



familiar and are already awaiting the caravan next year, you may bear with me and maybe hear something you did not know.

I know some of the caravan captains have already posted their introductions which puts me behind the power curve but I am trying to catch up. When the National Corvette Museum had its opening celebration in 1994, a grass movement among Corvette owners around the country sprang up and Corvettes by the thousands descended on Bowling Green to join in on the festivities. Everyone had so much fun that it was held once again in 1999 to celebrate the 5th Anniversary of the museum.

To bring some order to the phenomenon, the NCM and Chevrolet worked together to coordinate a caravan in 2003 to honor the 50th Birthday of the Corvette. Captains were appointed by the Caravan Committee and rules and regulations established to formalize the event and to create a larger and better disciplined program. In 2009, the caravans were back on the five year plan and the 15th Anniversary of the NCM was honored. How time flies. Here we are on the cusp of the 20th Anniversary of the museum and the 5th National Corvette Caravan.

I encourage everyone to visit the caravan website and look up the page that is dedicated to your area. If you haven't already received an e-mail from your captain, you soon will or may contact them at the site on the NCM Caravan site. Thanks for listening and we hope to see all of you in August of 2014, either in one of the caravans or as a drop in at the National Corvette Museum.
