"Upon arrival it was discovered that a sinkhole had collapsed within the Museum. No one was in or around the Museum at the time. The Bowling Green Fire Department arrived on the scene and secured the area. The Fire Department has estimated the size of the hole is 40 feet across and 25-30 feet deep. 

Community Activities

CCCC Community Involvement - 2013:

- A total of \$1,240, plus assorted grocery items, was donated by members to the Greater Lansing Food Bank at our Holiday Party in December. Of this, \$500 was designated from the club treasury and another \$700 was raised at the party.
- Our annual BINGO event with the seniors at Tamarack Apartments was held on November 9 with a variety of prizes, donated by members of CCCC. An ice cream social was held after the game with CCCC members bringing desserts to share.
- \$5,000 was raised for the Potter Park Zoo.
 These funds were raised during our annual
 Horsepower at the Zoo car show, with
 assistance by members of the Capital Area
 Muscle Car Club, on September 12.
- More than \$1,500 was raised for the VFW National Home for Children during the Blessing

- of the Vettes annual car show and rallies on June 8.
- A \$500 automotive scholarship was provided to Hector Rios Rosas, a Capital Area Career Center student in the memory of John Bechtel, former President of Capital City Corvette Club.
- A \$250 automotive scholarship was provided to Kevin Hutton, a Capital Area Career Center student in the memory of Colin J. Nethaway, who died in a car accident while on his way to the career center. Kevin's parents were once members of Capital City Corvette Club, and Kevin was a FCOA member as a child.

Almost \$9,000 was donated back to the community in 2013 through our different fund raising efforts and events. In addition, CCCC members assisted the Capital Area Muscle Car Club in raising \$5,700 for Sparrow Hospice Services through two car shows during the summer of 2013.

NCCC Scholarship Program:

The NCCC Scholarship program is funded through donations from Clubs, individuals and corporate friends such as Mid America Motorworks. The NCCC Scholarship Committee awards \$1,000.00 scholarships to worthy young people who have some connection with NCCC through a Father, Mother, Grandfather, Grandmother, etc., who has been a member of NCCC for at least three years. "Some connection" implies that the Applicant's relatives should have knowledge of the various requirements of the Scholarship Program. If the relative is not the Applicant's parent, the relative must write a letter to be included with the completed application indicating the following:

- His/Her relationship to the applicant
- His/Her NCCC Member Number
- That He/She will be the Applicant's Sponsor
- That He/She has been closely involved with NCCC for a period of three or more years.

Social Time and Dining: 5:00 - 7:00 p.m.

President: Sandy Bechtel called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. She reported there are questions regarding the income portion of the 2014 budget. She requested approval for Treasurer Mike Britz to allow him to pay bills until the budget is finalized at the March meeting.

MOTION was made by Simon Reiffer and SUPPORTED by Dave Pursel to approve the the request to allow Treasurer Mike Britz to pay all bills received prior to the March General Meeting. MOTION CARRIED.

Sandy reminded those in attendance to be sure to remove all copies of the budget from the meeting room upon dismissal of the meeting. According to Sandy, Sue VanAtta-Wright is retiring from Jackson National.

Secretary: Katherine Twining asked for any corrections/additions to the January 8, 2014
Membership Meeting Minutes. In addition,
Katherine expressed her appreciation to Janet lansiti for filling in and recording the minutes.
There being no additions or corrections,
MOTION was made by Simon Reiffer and
SUPPORTED by Howard Hein to approve the January 8, 2014 Membership Meeting Minutes.
MOTION CARRIED.

Governor/VP: Simon Reiffer reported the upcoming regional meeting will be held at La Senoritas on February 18, and that information regarding the meeting is on the CCCC calendar. The National Governor's Meeting will be held in St. Louis. Information about the Awards Banquet to be held in Battle Creek is on the website. Simon

shared that Florida and Michigan are the only two single state regions in NCCC. CCCC receives Region points by hosting rallies car shows, etc.

Treasurer: Mike Britz was not attendance as he is in Florida, but President Bechtel was informed all bills are paid. Questions regarding the 2014 budget will be addressed at a future CCCC meeting.

Points: Sally Wardell was not in attendance.

Membership: Dave Pursel shared that he is dealing with issues on the National level. The Future Corvette Owners of America (FCOA) membership in Michigan currently stands at 50. For any new members in attendance, Dave informed them that there is a one-time fee of \$10 for children up to the age of 16, and that Michigan has the largest FCOA membership numbers. To date, 98 CCCC members are current for 2014. He reports that there are a number of issues with the NCCC data base whether or not forms and signatures are required. In addition, there is confusion regarding FCOA applicants. Approved at the September NCCC meeting, corvette ownership is not required to join and be a member of NCCC.

Editor: Jerry Wardell was not in attendance.

Competition: Mike Sprague presented an update on his dealings with confirming July 26 and 27 dates at Spartan Speedway. He will need confirmation from both CCCC and the Jackson Clubs. Mike shared that the track rate has been raised considerably from \$1,200 to \$1,400. The clubs will have to pay \$1,600 for the event; if the track is left clean, the \$200 cleaning deposit will be returned. This will result in a charge of \$1,400 for the event. He checked out rental fees from other oval tracks and was given a fee of \$700 to \$750 per day. Following much discussion, Simon proposed that we move ahead with the project.

MOTION was made by Dave Pursel and SUPPORTED by Chuck Miller that CCCC move forward with scheduling the July dates, which included the total \$1,600 charge with the \$200

Simon Reiffer stated date for the Blessing of the Vettes needs to be confirmed. He shared that Bob Maynard is checking with Culvers in Okemos regarding potential dates. Simon needs to get dates nailed down. Blessing of the Vettes entails three events: The Blessing, car show and two rallies.

Public Relations: Dave Averill has been in contact with several newspapers to place meeting notices. A renewal is in the process with Storage Pro. Dave has spoken with the Grand Ledge Public Schools and they have ok'd a car show for "Blessing of the Backpack." This possible event will be brought up at the March meeting to share information.

Consensus was that, if there is no chair decided upon by May, the event may have to be cancelled. Since 2005, approximately \$33,500 has been donated to the Zoological Society and, during that time, there was one year that the event was not held. Simon said that he and Gloria will work on the gimmick rallye for the Blessing and Mike Britz may work with the second rallye. Bud Kouts Chevrolet has renewed their sponsorship for 2014.




Vehicle Diagnostics Connector from Wikipedia, the free encyclopedia

In 1980 General Motors implemented a proprietary interface and protocol for testing of the Engine Control Module (ECM) on the vehicle assembly line designated the 'assembly line diagnostic link' (ALDL) protocol. Implemented on California vehicles for the 1980 model year, and the rest of the United States in 1981, the ALDL was not intended for use outside the factory.



The only available function for the owner is "Blinky Codes". By connecting pins A and B (with ignition key ON and engine OFF), the 'Check Engine Light' (CEL) or 'Service Engine Soon' (SES) blinks out a two-digit number that corresponds to a specific error condition.

In 1994 General Motors initiated OBD 1.5, a partial implementation of OBD-II protocol used on some vehicles in 1994, 1995, & 1996. (GM did not use the term OBD 1.5 in the documentation for these vehicles — they simply have an OBD and an OBD-II section in the service manual. The 94-95 Corvettes have one postcatalyst oxygen sensor (although they have two catalytic converters), and have a subset of the OBD-II codes implemented.



History

- 1980 ALDL (Assembly Line Diagnostic Link) implementation by GM begins
- 1986 ALDL upgraded by GM with faster communication
- 1991 OBD (On Board Diagnostics) mandated by CARB (California)
- 1994 OBD 1.5 a partial implementation of OBD 11 by GM
- 1996 OBD 11 mandated for all cars sold in the US

Check Engine Light or malfunction indicator lamp (MIL)

The malfunction indicator lamp on the dash board usually bears the legend check engine, service engine soon, or a pictogram of an engine. In the United States, specific functions (emission related) are required of the MIL by EPA regulations. On vehicles equipped with OBD-II, the light has two stages: steady (indicating a minor fault such as a loose gas cap or failing oxygen sensor) and flashing (indicating a severe fault, that could potentially damage the catalytic converter if left uncorrected for an extended period). When the MIL is lit, the engine control unit stores a fault code related to the malfunction, which can be retrieved with a scan tool and used for further diagnosis.

Sun Visor removal information and photos provided by Corvette forum

Have a tattered or torn sun visor? This applies to C5's and may work on C6's. The picture below shows the driver's side sun visor in the removal position. With the visor tilted down insert a flat blade screwdriver into the slot, on the bezel ring, as shown. Rotate the sun visor counterclockwise, towards the driver's side window.

The sun visor's shaft will press on the screwdriver blade. The assembly will rotate together towards the side window. (You will simultaneously be pushing upwards on the screwdriver to keep the tip of the screwdriver in that little slot on the bezel ring.) After a 1/4 or less turn, the sun visor will simply drop down, now unattached. Disconnect the male connector by pressing the white tab to release it and pull apart


