From Our President

It's May – sunshine, apple blossoms, robins, and sports cars. And, of course, insurance for those cars. When any vehicle is relatively new, it's pretty easy for an adjuster to establish what its value is in the event of a loss. As vehicles age, though, it becomes more and more difficult to make sure your classic, collector, antique, or custom vehicle is properly insured.

If you purchase a "Standard" or "Actual Cash Value" policy, the insurance company's limit of liability for a physical damage loss or theft will be the lesser of: The vehicle's actual cash value (depreciated value) at the time of the loss, the amount necessary to repair the vehicle, or any applicable limit of liability shown of the Declarations Page of the policy.

If you purchase a "Stated Value" policy, the company's limit of liability is the same as that of a standard policy. The insurer is obligated to pay the lesser of the stated amount, the cost of repairs (not to exceed the stated amount), or the vehicle's actual cash value. There seems to be a common misconception that a person will automatically get the stated value in the event of a loss. That value helps determine your premium costs. When the vehicle is damaged or stolen, though, it does not guarantee you a settlement equal to the stated value.

The only policy that guarantees what amount you will receive if your vehicle is totaled or stolen is an "Agreed Value" policy. Under such a policy, the insurer's liability is the lesser of the agreed amount or the cost to repair the vehicle (not to exceed the agreed amount). The policy does not include an actual cash value clause. You and your agent must agree upon the "agreed amount" of coverage before your policy is issued. That amount should represent the true market value of the car at the time the policy is written. If the market value changes during the policy period, the agreed amount can be changed by endorsement. You should also make any necessary changes at each renewal, so the policy continues to accurately reflect the vehicle's market value.

The bottom line is – purchase the policy that meets your needs, and then keep current on your appraisals. The burden to prove what your Corvette is really worth rests with you.

So, do your homework, then relax. Let's have a safe, accident-free 2014. Don't forget to save the wave!

Parking Lot: Sandy Bechtel said the Delhi Café parking lot should be in good shape by the May 7 membership meeting.



LOOKING FOR SOMETHING DIFFERENT TO ADD TO YOUR 'VETTE? HOW ABOUT A CAR TELEPHONE?

Not too long ago, *CN* had a visitor. Mr. Sandy Moser of Ferndale, Michigan, who is in the communications business, told us he was looking for a car telephone he could install himself in his 1977 Corvette — one which would not deface the car's interior. All the phones he came across required a large trunk unit and a special antenna designed for a fiberglass bodied car, so he decided to put his own package together.

He used a trunk unit 10 1/4" wide x 12" deep and 4" high. The unit fits into a keyed locking bracket, which Sandy installed on the deck behind the driver's seat. He mounted a G.A.M. antenna on the gas tank lid and says it works great in a fiberglass body. The control head mounts nicely on the arm rest.

The time it took to install the entire unit? Just 30 minutes. And Sandy can dial calls direct from the car or go through a mobile operator.

Air Induction/Cold Air Intake

Want to add 10 to 15 horsepower to your C5 or C6 and not spend an arm and a leg? Try an air induction system mod. It's easy to do and doesn't require any modifications to your corvette. Simply remove your existing air cleaner, air intake duct and hoses. Replace with a low restriction aftermarket system and you're ready to go. There are several manufactures to choose from, K&N, Blackwing, and Vortex to name a few.

If you don't mind making a few modifications and spending a little more, you can gain another 10 or so ponies with a cold air intake system. And add a high flow cat back exhaust

system mod to take full advanced of your new intake.
