# Ambassador's Travels

First I would like to apologize, because it has been a while since I have written an update regarding my travels as the club's ambassador. As most of you know, I have been filling in for Capital City Corvette Club's NCM Ambassador for the last three years. I have been the ambassador for the Corvette Club of Michigan for ten years. For the last ten years I have been attending, at minimum, two events per year at the National Corvette Museum, one of which is the mandatory ambassador meeting during the Labor Day event. Five years ago, I was accepted as a board member to the National Corvette Museum, which required me to attend four meetings in Bowling Green throughout the year. Over the last ten years I have estimated that I have put a grand total of about thirty-five thousand miles on my cars travelling to and from the museum for events, meetings, and caravan routes, with a lot of memorable moments and miles along the way.

At the beginning of this year I decided that after ten years, I would take a break from carrying the NCM banner. My main goal for this year was to participate in the twentieth anniversary celebration, but due to my job I was unable to participate in the



caravan, but I was still able to attend the event and meet up with fellow club members in Bowling Green.

This year started off with an NCM board meeting, that was held in Charlotte, North Carolina. The board was hosted by Mr. Rick Hendrick. We travelled to his facility and got a tour of the racing shops where they build the race cars for Jimmie Johnson, Jeff Gordon, Dale Earnhart, Jr. and Casey Khane. After our tour of the shops and our meeting, we got a tour of "Mr. H's" private collection of automobiles.

The only way to describe this collection is Outstanding! In a beautifully appointed warehouse, was over one hundred and fifty of the most beautifully restored or original automobiles, representing everything from late thirties to present day. Most cars were of GM vintage, but to see the arrangements and storefronts that represented his life was absolutely amazing. I felt very fortunate to view this collection, because it is not open to the public. Later in the evening, while we were having dinner in the administration building, Mr. Hendrick was able to stop in and speak with us for about an hour. Also during this trip, I got the opportunity to drive a new 2014 Corvette Stingray, that was owned by a fellow board member. All I can say is if the base car is the this good, the Z06 will be awesome!





When I returned home from this meeting, we all learned the next morning about the great "Sink hole" that opened up at the NCM. It has been well publicized that eight Corvettes went into that hole. I am happy to report that three of the eight cars will be repaired and the room will be rebuilt as good as new. But what really hits home for me is that twelve years ago, Jennifer and I took delivery of our new 2003 Corvette, as part of the R8C Delivery program, and right where we were presented with our car inside the spire, is where that hole opened up. As I have done for the last ten years, I returned to the NCM in April, to attend the Birthday Bash. It is my way of getting the car out of hibernation and getting ready for the "Corvette Season". I travelled to the museum with a couple of close friends and we got to see the sink hole up close, but more importantly we learned about the new colors and options for the 2015 model year.

Over the past six years now, I have been attending the C4/ZR-1 Gathering, which is an event held in May at the museum for the C4 generation of the Corvette. This is a small event, but as a ZR-1 owner it is an important event, because you get a chance to meet some

of the most knowledgeable people that were/are affiliated with this

particular genre of Corvette. One of the highlights I had this year was the opportunity to actually drive and compete in the autocross event with one of the eight "Black Widow" ZR-1's. This particular car was owned by Jim VanDorn.

If you think driving a stock C4 generation ZR-1 was a thrill, try driving one that has been modified by Dough Rippie Motorsports. Needless to say, some of the after-market tuners really know how to squeeze just a

The caravan was well attended and it repeated some of the venues and routes we did in 2009. When I did make it to the museum for the weekend, the big news was the Grand Opening of the Motorsports Park. Participants got the chance to see

the Corvette Racing Team practice on the new track, but participants also got the chance to take either parade laps or hot laps. The track was busy all weekend, and as a board member, I can see where this will be a wonderful addition to the entire Corvette experience, once you arrive in Bowling Green. As the weekend wound down, I attended the Hall of Fame banquet. This year the Hall of Fame inductees consisted of Dave MacDonald, enshrined for Corvette Racing, Jerry Burton in the Enthusiast category, and John Heinricy for Chevrolet. All remarkable people who contributed greatly to Corvette.



In looking for just one more adventure as the Summer turned to Fall, I finally decided this would be the year I try to adventure to another state for a Fall Color Tour. One such tour I have had on my list for a while is a tour in southern Ohio that is put on by a Corvette restoration shop known as the Restoration Station. This shop is located in Springboro, Ohio and the event is held the third Sunday in October each year. I took a leisurely drive down early this Sunday morning, passing through small towns and viewing the typical old court houses along the way. When I finally arrived in Springboro, I was amazed to see well over two hundred Corvettes assembled for this cruise. Coffee and donuts were available and tours of the shop. Then a very well organized driver's meeting was held and we were off for about a two hour drive over some of the most beautiful country roads that Ohio had to offer. The event was well organized and the participants were very friendly, even after they learned I was from Michigan. Some thought it was strange that I would drive for four hours, just to drive for another two hours, then return home for another four hour trip. Hey, what can I say, I like to drive and when piloting a Corvette who cares how far or how long!

That has been a thumbnail report of my travels this year as the ambassador. There have been shows I have attended and other local gatherings, but after ten years I have decided to turn the reigns over or allow someone else the opportunities to travel and get out and spread the word about the National Corvette Museum and their club's involvement with it. I have gotten rid of my vintage ZR-1 and my 2007 Z06.

#### Corvette collection surfaces after 25 years

Twenty five or so years ago, Peter Max the artist, purchased a collection of 36 Chevrolet Corvettes, one from every year of manufacture up until 1989. His plan was to use these vettes to self-promote his work as an artist, painting the machines in wild colors and staging them in various locations.

But that didn't happened. Instead, the collection sat in a New York City storage garage for a quarter of a century. Gathering dust, moved only when location was changed from one storage area to another.
