### **NCCC Convention in Atlantic City, NJ**

After completing registration and hotel check-in, we headed to the Hospitality Room. The Hospitality Room was open every afternoon during convention and offered snacks, beverages and a variety of puzzles to put together while visiting with old friends and making new ones. The Corvette Mall was located in the same room so we could check out items for purchase from many vendors.

Sunday night's Welcome Party had great entertainment. Simon and I helped close the party down.



Monday was the People's Choice, Concours and Funkhana, as well as a Tech Talk from Michelin Tires. The National Awards Banquet was held Monday night with the Michigan Region being well represented. In the Men's competition, Rene Cardenas placed #1 with 3,886 points (396 events); and Bruce Wentzel placed #7 with 2,704 points (275 events). In the Ladies competition, Carolyn McLemore placed #1 with 3,563 points (382 events); Mary Wentzel placed #3 with 2,759 points (275 events); and Constance Esposito placed #5 with 1,951 points (215 events). That's a LOT of weekends of competition!

Following the top competitor awards, Mike Godfrey received the Don Hoskins Memorial Award. Next up was the Past Presidents' Award. Recipients of this award are chosen by a committee of three or more former NCCC Presidents. It is given to individuals that "have made a valuable and/or lasting impact on NCCC" at the local, regional or national level. Imagine our shock when Dave Heinemann named Simon and I as this year's recipients!





We had just made our way back to our seats when Dale Samuelson began describing his choice for the Presidents' Award. "The Presidents' Award is presented annually to the member who has made the most outstanding contribution to NCCC for service to all our club members." We heard Dave say that this was only the second time that a member received both the Past Presidents' and the Presidents' Awards in the same year. That sure caught our attention as Simon was named as this year's recipient! The tradition is to fill it with treats from your state for the next years' recipient. Simon later said "Rice Krispies it is!" Dave told us later that the recipients are kept top secret until the presentation at the banquet. They had no idea that they each had chosen Simon.

We went on a bus trip to Cape May on Tuesday and enjoyed a trolley tour and a visit to the Emily Physick Estate. It poured rain during the time we were scheduled walk around Cape May so I grabbed food for Simon and I to eat on the bus. (I was drenched.) High and low speed events also took place, at New Jersey Motorsports Park that day.



- We currently have 17,767 members and 600 just since February. There are 234 clubs and the Corvette Delivery at the Museum has brought in 79 new members.
- Safety concerns were brought up. At a function sponsored by West Coast Corvette Association, a worker was hit by a car and killed. The family is suing and the Association could lose everything and have to fold.
- A National Safety Committee has been formed. There will be no more seated corner workers on the track. All people entering events must sign a waiver, not just the competitors. At all events, please try and have someone stationed at the gate.
- Legacy Insurance is still insuring us but they are not happy with non-members running/working events.
- There will be no drag race at Convention this year, not enough racers.
- There are 9 scholarships to be given out this year. Average of \$1,000 each.
- The National President sends out 12,500 monthly reports by email.
- NCCC Convention will be in Bowling Green next year and in Joplin, MO in 2024.
- The following officers are up for election this fall: President, VP of Membership, Treasurer, Parliamentarian and Public Relations Director.
- There is up to \$1,000 available if a member has a hardship.


