

President's Page

Members,



March is at our front doors. For most of us, this will be the month we start to consider getting our Corvettes out for the driving season. This is your annual reminder that you need to check a few maintenance items before driving. First and foremost for safety, check the date codes on your tires. Anything over 6 years old, no matter the miles, is suspect. If your tires reach 10 years old, they need to be replaced.

The rest are general maintenance items that need to be looked at to ensure one of your early drives does not come to an unexpected early end. You should have had your car on a battery maintainer and a treated tank of gasoline to eliminate any issues there. Move on to checking your belts, hoses, and vacuum lines for any cracks or dry rotting and replace as necessary. Make sure all of your fluids are topped off and check for any new leaks you may not be aware of. The last thing is a personal recommendation of mine. Since gasoline now contains up to 10% ethanol, which absorbs moisture, I like to get the first tank of fuel through my car before driving it aggressively.

Also for this month, I want to brag about the activities of our club. Some of our members may not be aware of how active Capital City Corvette Club is in our community or the impact we are having. I am currently serving the MI Region of NCCC as the Regional Competition Director. Melissa Felts, my wife, is serving on the Nation Board of NCCC as the appointed Director of FCOA. We have 3 members that will receive competition awards at the regional level this year. Year over year we have recently carried around 100 members. Our Governor, Simon Reiffer, was recognized nationally by receiving the President's Award at the 2022 National Convention. While doing all of this, we as a club, also contributed over \$12,000 to our community last year. We have multiple members that represent us at the NCCC National Convention annually as well. Working on our 66th year, we are a strong, active, and generous organization, one you should be proud to be a member of. So get out there in your Capital City shirts and tell other Corvette owners about us. We could do even more with a larger membership.
