The Scenic Wisconsin Dells and Lake Delton area is an exciting and beautiful resort area to gather for partying as well as sightseeing, driving unique roads and exploring everything the area has to offer. Wisconsin Dells is the Water Park Capital of the World and so much more!



Wisconsin Dells is about an hour north of Madison, WI. There is plenty to see and do in the Dells and even more throughout the surrounding area. The Host Hotel will be The Kalahari Resorts & Convention Center including its Hillside facility conveniently located for all activities just off I-90/94 at Exit 92.

The Room Rate at The Kalahari will be \$156.03 including taxes and free parking. There will not be a daily resort fee. Guests will have free entry to the Tom Foolery Amusement Park as well as free use of their Indoor and Outdoor Water Parks. I hope you were able to stay warm during the Polar Vortex that impacted the lower 48 states in January. During this cold season, it can be challenging to find automotive events. Recently, at the Barrett-Jackson auction, there was some surprising action: a Base 2013 C6 was sold for \$330,000, and the reason for this hefty price tag remains unclear. The car has only 16 miles on it, which seems to be its only noteworthy feature.

In exciting news, the Corvette nameplate has launched the ZR1 edition of the C8. It's astonishing to think that you can acquire a 1,000-horsepower car simply by writing a check. This was previously unheard of for a vehicle that is both street-legal and warrantied by an OEM. Given the capabilities of the base C8 Stingray, the variants produced—including the ZR1, E-Ray, and Z06—are nothing short of amazing. It certainly raises questions about what might be coming next with the C9.

Points Program Changes. Kim Keith gave the board a summary of what the club's points program included and that the intent of the program was to get club members to participate in Corvette activities, especially those that CCCC sponsored. He recommended three changes to the points program:

- Under Competition Events, update wording for the car show to "Shaheen Chevrolet Car Show" from "Shaheen Children's Miracle Network Car Show", and update wording for our low-speed event to "CCCC Low Speeds" from "Corrigan Oil Speedway". The motion to approve was made by Kyle Felts, seconded by Simon Reiffer, and approved by the majority of Board members in attendance.
- 2. Under the Other Points category, Kim recommended awarding two points for each day visiting the National Corvette Museum (NCM) in Bowling Green, KY. The motion to approve was made by Simon Reiffer, seconded by Kevin Mead, and approved by the majority of Board members in attendance.
- 3. Under Competition Events, Kim recommended we change the number of points awarded when attending another club's sanctioned competition racing event from five to three points. The motion to approve was made by Simon Reiffer, seconded by Kevin Mead, and approved by the majority of Board members in attendance.
- The three changes above will be presented to the Membership for their approval.
- There was a lengthy discussion about whether the points program was helping to drive attendance. The consensus was that it probably wasn't, but past attempts to eliminate the program were unsuccessful. In the end, the Board agreed that it was probably better at recognizing participation, rather than increasing participation.

- There was a question why points per day for attending the National Convention were less than
  visiting the NCM? The Board discussion was that although you may only get one point per day, it
  probably was actually more once you participated in the events that accompany the National
  Convention.
- The Board felt that some individuals may not be participating in Funkhanas or Rallyes because of uncertainty about what they were getting into. The club has tried to prevent this by having "mock" events. The Board also mentioned about perhaps using a mentorship program whereby experienced members help out newcomers who show interest in these events.

Participation Incentive – is the Points Program Idea — covered above.

Known Events for the Year include the Blessings Car Show, Birch Run Low-Speed Event, Fill-the-Pantry, and Shaheen Show. There was discussion about how to increase participation at events. The Board agreed that the things that increased participation included the venue, the opportunity for an award, and advertising. One suggestion was to create flyers and distribute them at other events. It was also felt that knowing with certainty that an event will be held on the same date and location every year helped drive participation. Kyle Felts has volunteered to chair the Shaheen Car Show. Other activities mentioned were Toys for Tots, with events occurring at both Lingenfelter's and Adado's, as well as National Corvette Day. Angela mentioned that Bingo at Tamarack Apartments is yet to be determined, but plans to do a Mock Rallye on May 4th. Kyle is going to try to get some sanction numbers to do either a Funkhana or Rallye, or both during the Fill-the-Pantry event.




