
# Vermontville Maple Syrup Festival Saturday ~ April 26, 2025 ~ 11:15

The Scenic Wisconsin Dells and Lake Delton area is an exciting and beautiful resort area to gather for partying as well as sightseeing, driving unique roads and exploring everything the area has to offer. Wisconsin Dells is the Water Park Capital of the World and so much more!



Wisconsin Dells is about an hour north of Madison, WI. There is plenty to see and do in the Dells and even more throughout the surrounding area. The Host Hotel will be The Kalahari Resorts & Convention Center including its Hillside facility conveniently located for all activities just off I-90/94 at Exit 92.




