

New Business:



Our nephew Mark is an accomplished engineer with 57 patents in his name, all this and he is blind. Mark loves Corvettes.

It was the best experience ever when Mark asked for a ride in our 2020 C8. Driving, I gained a deeper appreciation for the engineering that went into these exceptional sports cars as Mark would describe to me what he was hearing and sensing as we rounded curves on perfect Corvette roads in Fairfield Glades, Tennessee.

There are no words to explain the feeling we had watching Mark "see" the Corvette by running his hands over its beautiful lines. He "saw" the curves and vents, the striping, the amazing C8 console... the entire car! Zora Arkus-Duntov's Only Corvette, Fully Preserved, to Debut at National Corvette Museum's 31st Anniversary

After a meticulous, multi-year preservation effort, the only Corvette ever owned by Zora Arkus-Duntov—the legendary "Godfather of the Corvette"—will make its public debut during the National Corvette Museum's 31st Anniversary Celebration, August 28–30, 2025.

Zora's personal 1974 custom two-tone blue Corvette Stingray, a retirement gift from Chevrolet, has been preserved with precision by the Museum's Collections and Preservation team. The body was carefully separated from the chassis, allowing complete access to the frame, suspension, and underbody. Each component was documented, cleaned, stabilized, and reinstalled to ensure its authenticity. Even the creased leather armrest on the driver's side—worn from years of Zora's elbow resting as he drove—was intentionally left untouched.

"This car represents Corvette history in its purest form," said Robert Maxhimer, Director of Curatorial Affairs and Education at the National Corvette Museum. "Preserving Zora's personal Corvette is the first of many in-depth preservation projects that will ensure our collection lasts for generations."

Zora Arkus-Duntov, inducted into the Corvette Hall of Fame in 1998, played a pivotal role in elevating the Corvette into a world-class performance vehicle. His personal 1974 Corvette Stingray features a 454 big block engine, automatic transmission, air conditioning, power steering and brakes, and aluminum wheels.

Originally silver, then later painted green, the car eventually received its iconic custom two-tone blue livery when Zora asked a friend for a new paint job. The final result, including his initials "ZAD" on the doors, was a surprise—but one Zora appreciated. His wife, Elfi, marked the occasion with a painting of Zora standing beside the car. A decal reading "Zora Arkus-Duntov Engineering Center" remains on the rear deck, serving as a subtle tribute to his legacy.

The preservation will be the centerpiece of a reimagined Corvette Hall of Fame exhibition, launching during the Anniversary weekend. Attendees will enjoy exclusive insights into the restoration process through expert-led sessions featuring the Museum's new generation of preservation professionals.

The National Corvette Museum's 31st Anniversary Celebration takes place August

28-30, 2025, in Bowling Green, Kentucky.

Tech Corner: Replacing the A/C Belt on a 2001 C5 Corvette

When a faint squeak under the hood caught my attention, I did the usual test — a quick mist of water on the serpentine belt while the engine was running. The noise changed, confirming the culprit: worn-out accessory belts. What followed was a quick but satisfying garage session replacing both the **6-rib main belt** and the **4-rib A/C belt** — all **without removing the airbox**.

Tools & Parts Used:

Tool Purpose

QuickJack 6000TL Car lift – increased access and comfort

15mm wrench For A/C belt tensioner (below)

15mm socket + ratchet For serpentine tensioner (above)

Flathead screwdriver Belt guiding (if needed)

Murray K040420 A/C belt (4-rib) – from O'Reilly Auto Parts

Continental 4060798 / 6PK2025 Serpentine belt (6-rib) – source unknown

Belt System Overview:

- Outer belt (6-rib): Alternator, power steering, water pump
- Inner belt (4-rib): A/C compressor
 Each has its own spring-loaded tensioner

Photo Log:

Old 4-rib Belt:
The root of the squeak — starting to chunk and crack:



Tight Clearance View:

This view shows the tight space between the crank pulley, frame rail, and steering rack—key for threading the Alternator belt, a little twist to flatten the belt to get between the rack and the pulley:



Step-by-Step Process

1. Diagnosis

- Squeak noticed under load
- Sprayed light water on belt pitch changed → belt slipping or dry

2. Lift the Car

- Raised the C5 on my QuickJack 6000TL
- Full underbody access and a better working angle up top

3. Remove the 6-Rib Belt

- Used 15mm socket and ratchet from above
- Rotated tensioner **clockwise** (as viewed from front)
- Carefully twisted the belt to sneak it between the frame rail and crank pulley

4. Remove the 4-Rib A/C Belt

- Accessed the tensioner **from below** with a 15mm **wrench**
- Also rotated clockwise to release tension
- Routing the new belt required working by feel visibility is limited
- A helper is nice to hold tension, but solo is manageable with patience
- Be careful not to drop the belt behind the crank pulley it's a tight area to recover from

5. Reinstall Both Belts

- A/C belt first
- Alternator belt second
- Took a few adjustments to make sure both were fully seated in their grooves

6. Final Test

- Started the car and checked belt tracking
- Ran A/C and verified smooth operation no noise, no drama

Final Tips:

- You don't need to remove the airbox it's tight, but doable from above and below with basic tools
- The spray water trick is great for identifying belt squeal
- Consider replacing both belts together they age out at the same pace
- A helper's hand is useful during routing, but not required
- Watch for the belt falling behind the crank pulley it's annoying to retrieve in tight quarters

Wrap-Up:

This kind of hands-on maintenance keeps your C5 reliable, and connects you to the car in a way no shop receipt ever could. Whether it's the belts, brakes, or bushings, these projects are a great way to gain confidence and save money.
