# Capital City Corvette Club Board Meeting Minutes September 17, 2025: Delhi Cafe & Zoom

**6:30 Call to Order:** Kyle Felts

• No mail was received.

• Kyle provided a summary of the Shaheen show, stating that it went very well this year with 261 cars attending.

#### 6:35 Board Reports:

Secretary: Tim Wells (filling in for Melissa Hass)

August Board minutes previously approved by email.

Treasurer: James Sutherland

• James reported that all bills are paid, and the books are balanced.

V/P Governor: Simon Reiffer

- Simon attended the Governor's Meeting last weekend and provided a summary:
  - o Membership at 2024 EOY was 17,182. Rebounded to 17,262 in 2025.
  - o No new insurance claims; one outstanding claim.
  - o National Corvette Museum membership is down but plant tours have been reinstated.
  - The NCM is putting together a new display recognizing the National Council of Corvette Clubs.
     "The Power of Grass Roots. A national network becomes a movement." They now realize that NCCC was a driving force behind getting the NCM off the ground.
  - NCCC has had a 650-member increase since the May meeting. They are asking that club
    information be updated on the far left of the screen to include the club address so that they can
    direct new Members at Large to a local club. It was requested that info get updated prior to
    October 1. I believe they said the membership database will be shut down on October 3 to
    change over to 2026 membership.
  - o A budget report was provided to the Governors.
  - The Business Manager is working on the next 3-year hotel contract. There were 2 claims filed against directors and officers.
  - The NCCC conventions are being planned to take place in Syracuse NY in 2026; Bowling Green KY in 2028; and Colorado in 2029. No convention bid for 2027 at this time.
  - o Reminded that we must keep signed waivers on file for 5 years; parental consent forms must be kept until the child is legally an adult in the state they reside in.
  - o By-Law and Standing Rules changes are in the works.
  - A You-Tube video about NCCC is in the works.
  - o Those running for office for 2026 include:
    - VP of Competition Rene Cardenas
    - Secretary Rita Robinson (?)
    - Business Manager Jeanne Cassel & Mark Hanlin
    - Sargent at Arms Tom West II
- o Elaine Herreta has requested articles for Blue Bars. Basically, if you've had a problem with your Corvette, and figured out how to fix it, submit a tech article to Blue Bars.
- o 2026 scholarship applications open on January 1 and close on May 15. There were 36 applicants in 2024 with 27 of them complete. Eight scholarships were given out.

## Board Meeting Minutes

- Walt Jenkins has requested that he be informed of all new Lifetime members so that he connect
  the points in the database since they would have LM added to their membership number after
  upgrading.
- o FCOA has 1,006 members; 44 new since January; 106 aged out.
- National awards were presented as follows:
  - Roger Clancy Humanitarian Award Dave and Joan Heinemann
  - President's Award Craig Kamradt
- Roll call for dues increase passed by 192 yes and 39 no (I think). Primary increased by \$15; Spouse
   Companion by \$5; Youth Dependent by \$5; Lifetime by \$200.
- 2025 convention reports were given. 395 attendees for the full week; 26 day passes; 1 youth; and worker passes were reinstated. Excess money will be split between the hosts and NCCC.
- The Regional Competition Directors met approximately 270 hours on Zoom and have put forth 11 rule changes and 7 new proposals to be voted on in November.
- Cost cutting items being discussed include dropping one meeting per year in St. Louis and dropping the annual membership cards, going to electronic cards only.

The changes regarding youth participation and dues increase will be presented to the General Membership at the October meeting for a vote.

# Tech Corner: Replacing the A/C Belt on a 2001 C5 Corvette

Field-Tested & Written by Kyle Felts, Capital City Corvette Club President

When a faint squeak under the hood caught my attention, I did the usual test — a quick mist of water on the serpentine belt while the engine was running. The noise changed, confirming the culprit: worn-out accessory belts. What followed was a quick but satisfying garage session replacing both the **6-rib main belt** and the **4-rib A/C belt** — all **without removing the airbox**.

#### **Tools & Parts Used:**

Tool Purpose

QuickJack 6000TL Car lift – increased access and comfort

15mm wrench For A/C belt tensioner (below)

15mm socket + ratchet For serpentine tensioner (above)

Flathead screwdriver Belt guiding (if needed)

Murray K040420 A/C belt (4-rib) – from O'Reilly Auto Parts

Continental 4060798 / 6PK2025 Serpentine belt (6-rib) – source unknown

### **Belt System Overview:**

- Outer belt (6-rib): Alternator, power steering, water pump
- Inner belt (4-rib): A/C compressor
   Each has its own spring-loaded tensioner

### **Photo Log:**

Old 4-rib Belt:
The root of the squeak — starting to chunk and crack:



#### **Tight Clearance View:**

This view shows the tight space between the crank pulley, frame rail, and steering rack—key for threading the Alternator belt, a little twist to flatten the belt to get between the rack and the pulley:



### **Step-by-Step Process**

#### 1. Diagnosis

- Squeak noticed under load
- Sprayed light water on belt pitch changed → belt slipping or dry

#### 2. Lift the Car

- Raised the C5 on my QuickJack 6000TL
- Full underbody access and a better working angle up top

#### 3. Remove the 6-Rib Belt

- Used 15mm socket and ratchet from above
- Rotated tensioner clockwise (as viewed from front)
- Carefully twisted the belt to sneak it between the frame rail and crank pulley

#### 4. Remove the 4-Rib A/C Belt

- Accessed the tensioner from below with a 15mm wrench
- Also rotated clockwise to release tension
- Routing the new belt required working by feel visibility is limited
- A helper is nice to hold tension, but solo is manageable with patience
- Be careful not to drop the belt behind the crank pulley it's a tight area to recover from

#### 5. Reinstall Both Belts

- A/C belt first
- Alternator belt second
- Took a few adjustments to make sure both were fully seated in their grooves

#### 6. Final Test

- Started the car and checked belt tracking
- Ran A/C and verified smooth operation no noise, no drama

### Final Tips:

- You don't need to remove the airbox it's tight, but doable from above and below with basic tools
- The spray water trick is great for identifying belt squeal
- Consider replacing both belts together they age out at the same pace
- A helper's hand is useful during routing, but not required
- Watch for the belt falling behind the crank pulley it's annoying to retrieve in tight quarters

### Wrap-Up:

This kind of hands-on maintenance keeps your C5 reliable, and connects you to the car in a way no shop receipt ever could. Whether it's the belts, brakes, or bushings, these projects are a great way to gain confidence and save money.


