2025 CCCC Points Report – Kim Keith



2025 CCCC Points Report

It took 88 points to reach the top ten in 2025. Our first-place member finished with 206 points.

The top five most attended events were:

The August General Membership Meeting	48 members
The November General Membership Meeting	41 members
The December Holiday Lunch	41 members
The May General Membership Meeting	40 members
The Fall Color Tour	39 members

Other major CCCC events such as Blessing had 37 members attending, followed by the Mackinaw Corvette Crossroads Show with 35, and the Shaheen Show with 32 members attending.

5 of our members visited the National Corvette Museum this past year where CCCC is a member club.

We had 13 members post zero points for the year.

Totaling all the points for all our members resulted in 1352 points being awarded in 2025 compared to 1287 points in 2024, so participation was up a little.

I have heard members state that you cannot reach the top ten without holding an elected office, however, four of our top ten members this year did not hold such a position in the club. As a matter of fact, working at a club competition event for just a couple hours will earn you 5 points, the same amount an elected officer receives for serving the entire year. Working at a club social event will earn you 3 points, the same amount an appointed officer receives for the entire year. Chairing, hosting, or organizing club events also offers an opportunity to gain points more quickly.

I encourage everyone in the club to participate in as many events as possible this coming year. It has been my pleasure to serve as your points director this past year and a half, and I hope you support Michael Lewis as he takes on the position, with the same respect that you have shown me.
