It is clear that Julie is truly committed to the quality and work ethic that is reflective of the standards of John Bechtel and the members of the Corvette Club as a whole.




Brennen Hitchcock Colin Nethaway Memorial Scholarship




Brandon Coppernoll & Brad Hoedeman Colin Nethaway Memorial Scholarships
